

hile a 19th-century legend of American firearms history inspires the name, the story of Henry Repeating Arms as you know it today began in Brooklyn, New York, in 1993 with the formation of the Colt Black

Powder Arms Company.

Anthony Imperato took out a home equity loan, leased a small factory space near the infamous Gowanus Canal, brought in some old equipment, hired a handful of employees, and began the assembly and sale of historic Colt revolvers and muskets under license from Colt's Manufacturing.

Along with his father, Louis Imperato, they began the development of a rimfire lever action rifle in 1996, and by March of 1997, the first Henry Repeating Arms model H001 rifles were shipped.

Together they leveraged the family's decades-long background in the firearms business and set out as Anthony had envisioned to be "the best long gun company in the firearms industry."

rom humble beginnings and a product catalog of only one rifle, Henry Repeating Arms is now the leading lever action manufacturer and one of the top 5 long gun manufacturers in America. The company employs over 550 people and operates three manufacturing facilities totaling more than 330,000 sq. ft.

At the ship's helm sits CEO & Founder Anthony Imperato, and President Andy Wickstrom. Louis Imperato served

as Chairman from the company's foundation until his passing in November 2007.

Today, the Henry Repeating Arms product catalog boasts well over 200 different rifles and shotguns in a broad range of calibers and finishes. From the H001 Classic Lever Action .22 that started it all to the flagship H004 Golden Boy or the ultra-modern X Models, there truly is a Henry that's right for everyone.

### 25 YEARS OF Made In America, Or Not Made At All

ith the motto, "Made in America, Or Not Made At All," it's no secret that we are huge proponents of putting Americans to

work making American products. From the genuine American Walnut stocks to the gun barrel quality steel to the hardened brass receivers, we have made a commitment from Day 1 to assemble our rifles and shotguns using domestic materials and craftsmanship. It is a guiding value, a part of our core DNA, and a promise.

With suppliers and partners all over the country, everything comes together at our three manufacturing facilities, the largest of which is the headquarters in Rice Lake, Wisconsin. This location is primarily responsible for all of Henry's centerfire rifles and shotguns that are not brass, with a few exceptions. What better place to make a classic blued

steel .30-30 lever action than in the middle of Wisconsin deer country?

Almost close enough to bask in the light of Lady Liberty's gold torch, Henry's Bayonne, New Jersey location produces the largest volume of rifles and is responsible for all rimfire rifles and all brass centerfire guns with a few exceptions. It is also home to the parts, apparel, and accessories store, HenryPride.com.

In 2021, Henry Repeating Arms acquired an 84,000 sq. ft. building in Ladysmith, Wisconsin, located 45 minutes away from Rice Lake. Today, this facility churns out parts that are then delivered to Rice Lake for final assembly in a finished firearm.

Rest assured, when you read the rollmark on the barrel of a Henry; it's going to say Made in the USA. ■



### Henry donates \$100,000 to the St. Vincent House at Peyton Manning Children's Hospital




## 25 YEARS OF HONORING RESPONDERS
